The following document is an early review of the collected data. It is meant to serve as a quick first look at what the gathered Mennonite Church Canada body is saying. It is subject to change with a more thorough review which will follow in the months ahead.

Session 6: International Witness Discernment

A Ministry of Companionship: Emerging Insights and Encouragement

The evolving model of ministry grounded in **companionship** is receiving strong affirmation from the responses reviewed. This new language is not only resonating—it is helping to shift perspectives, especially for those who may have previously held a more transactional or negative view of mission. It opens space for **imagination**, inviting the church to slow down, to notice, and to attend to the presence and movement of God.

Respondents expressed encouragement in how **relationships and financial support** are integrated within this paradigm. Supporting **Witness workers** remains a vital expression of this companionship, as does the broader work of **International Witness (IW)**.

Opportunities for International Witness

There is a clear invitation for IW to deepen its engagement in the following areas:

- **Storytelling**: The strongest encouragement from respondents was to continue sharing stories—through new media and in-person encounters. Bringing the people and their stories into congregational life is essential.
- Youth Exchange: Welcoming youth from the global church to Canada for mutual learning and service
- **Global Church Presence in Canada**: Exploring how to receive and support mission workers from the global church who are called to serve in Canada.

Pathways to Deeper Connection

As IW continues to connect Mennonite Church Canada congregations with the global church, these relationships can lead to richer, reciprocal exchanges such as:

- Shared prayer practices across cultures and communities.
- **Hospitality through shared spaces**, including offering church buildings to global congregations already present in our neighborhoods.
- Cross-cultural partnerships with mono-cultural congregations within Canada, fostering mutual learning and solidarity.
